Qin Shi Huang united all the kingdoms after years of fierce fighting during the Warring States period. One by one, he defeated the rival kingdoms and brought them under his control. In 221 BCE, he declared himself the first emperor of a unified China. Instead of separate rulers, the whole country was now governed by one central authority.

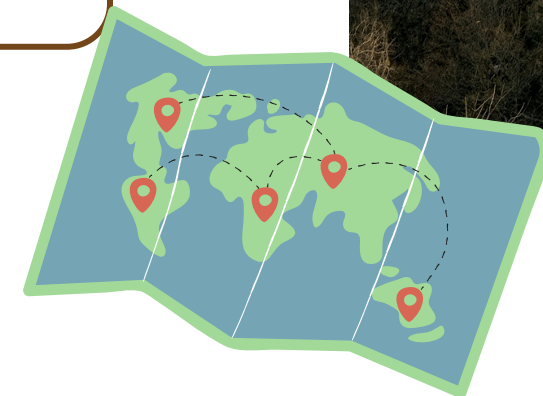

Giant pandas eat almost only bamboo; up to 20 kg a day! Because bamboo is low in nutrients, they need to eat for up to 12 hours a day to get enough energy. They use their strong jaws and special “thumb” to grip and crush the tough bamboo stems, leaves, and shoots.

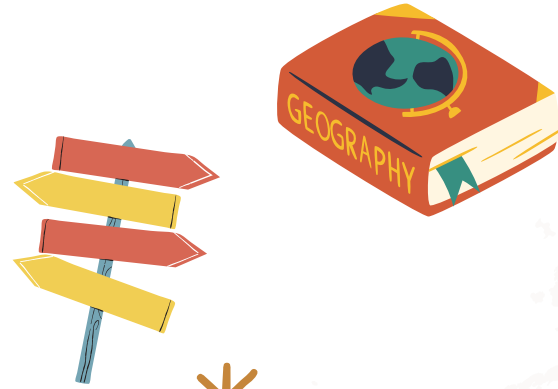

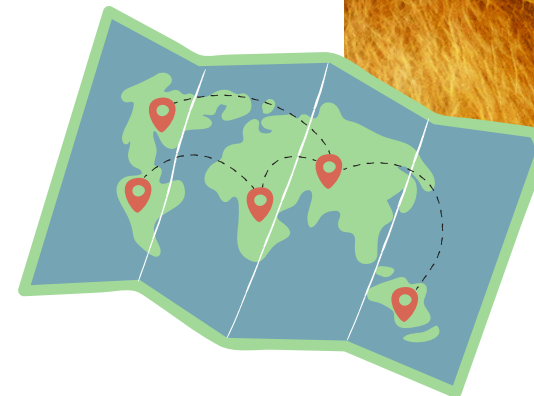

The golden snub-nosed monkey is named after Roxellane, the wife of an Ottoman sultan, because she was often described as having reddish-golden hair and a small, upturned nose. Early scientists thought the monkey's bright golden fur and unusual nose looked similar, so they named the species after her.
