

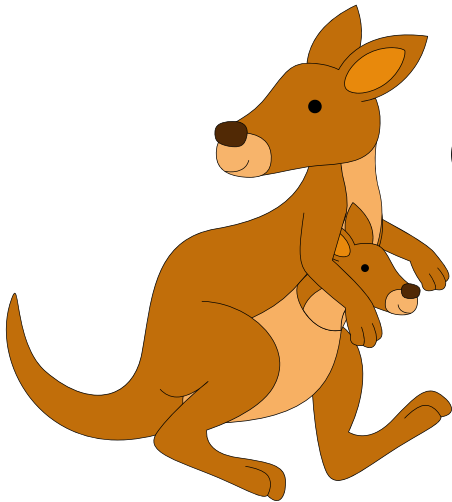

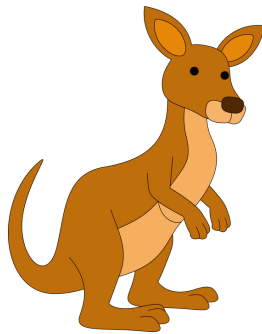
Mission: Kangaroo Measurement

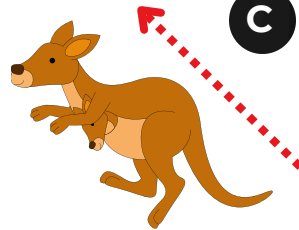

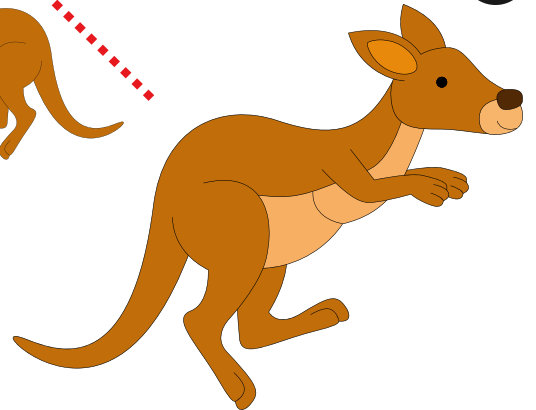

The koala mother eats eucalyptus leaves, poops, and lets her little one eat the poop, known as pap.



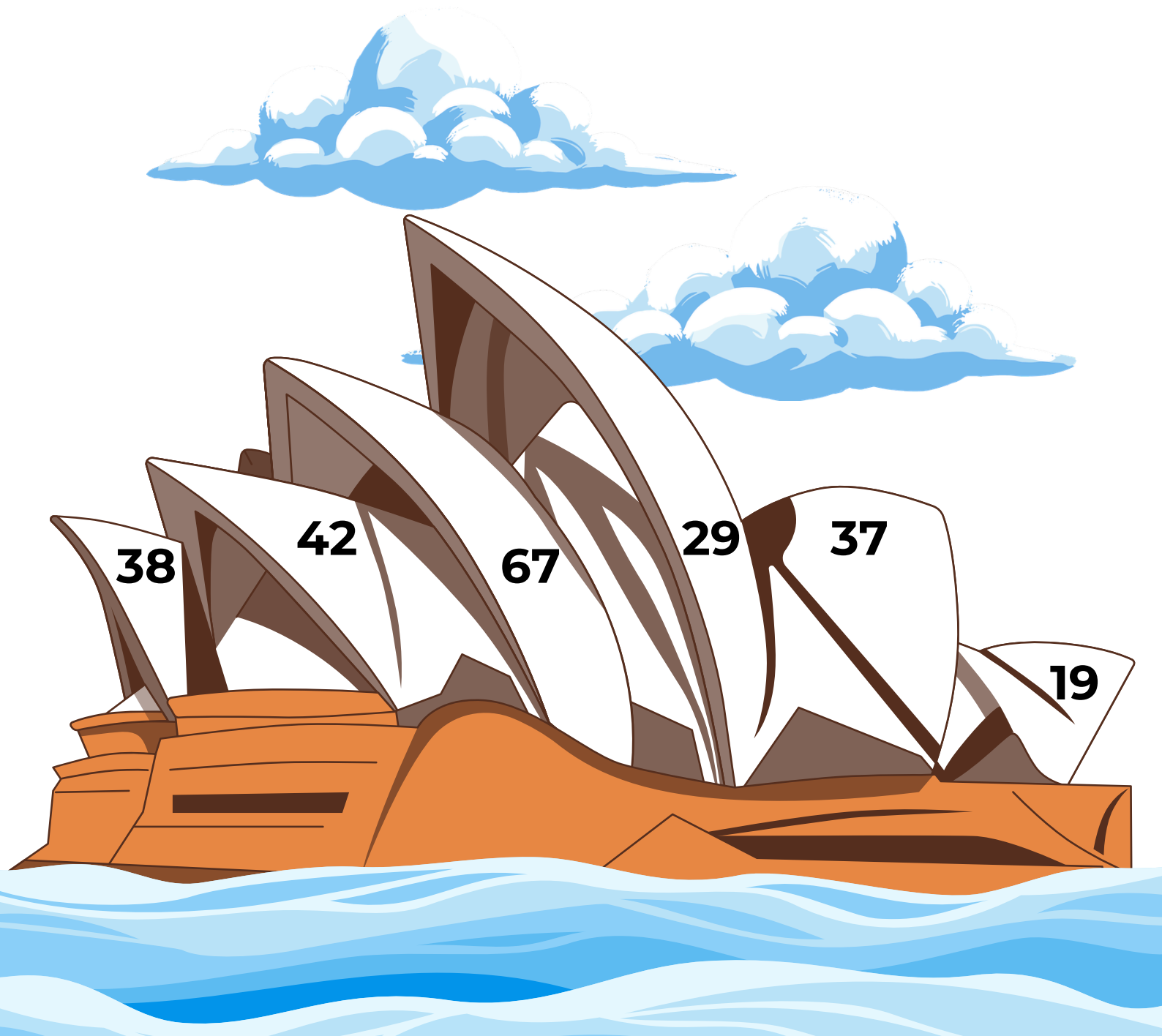


